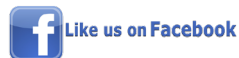




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ADMINISTRATION

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Saint Francis Catholic Academy is a four-year, coeducational, AP Capstone, Catholic high school established in North Central Florida in 2004 by the Diocese of St. Augustine. We currently educate over 250 students in grades nine through twelve. As a college preparatory school, Saint Francis welcomes all students who seek a college education, preparing each graduate to enroll in an institution of higher education. We strive to create an environment where students have the ability to succeed and grow spiritually, intellectually and athletically. Dual enrollment opportunities are offered on campus through Barry University and online through Santa Fe College and the University of Florida.

Advanced Placement:

In May 2023, 110 students in grades 9-12 sat for AP Exams; 228 exams were administered in 17 different subjects; 76% of the scores were 3 or higher, qualifying for college credit. 39 students earned AP Scholar honors; eight were awarded the Capstone Diploma; three additional students received the AP Seminar and Research Certificate.

Grade and Rank:

All students take at least seven courses each year. Cumulative GPAs include all course grades for each semester. The annual grade is computed by averaging quarter grades with semester exams. Class rank is based on all students and on all subjects. GPA and class rank are weighted. AP students are required to take AP Exams. Placement is based on completion of requirements and AP potential from PSAT scores or teacher recommendations.
